### **ANNUAL REPORT 2019-2020**

#### • PROJECT 1: PASUMAI: TREE PLANTATION DRIVE

The Department of English participated in the *Tree for Birds Program*, a mass sapling plantation drive at the Paruthipattu Lake on 27-07-2019. The program was organised by the Isha Project Green hands and Ma. Foi Foundation in memory of the late President A.P.J. Abdul Kalam's Death Anniversary.

The chief guests for the day were Mr.Ma.Foi.K.Pandiarajan, Minister for Tamil Official Language and Tamil Culture, Tmt. MageshwariRavikumar, IAS, Tiruvallur District Collector, K. Krishnamoorthy, Commissioner, Avadi and Palaniswamy, Executive Engineer, Public Works Department, Tiruvallur.

Mrs.S.Shobana, Head of the Department of English, Assistant Professors of the Department of English, Mrs.G.Tamilselvi, Mrs.R.Anuradha, Mrs.JasmineRazack, Ms.N.Keerthana and 73 students from I, II and III B.A English participated in the program enthusiastically and planted the saplings. Saplings of fruit trees, flowering and shade trees such as Neem, IndianBeeach (pungai) Lebbeck (iyalvagai) Jamun, Fig, Peepal, Mahuva(iluppai) and Badam were planted. Nearly two saplings were planted around the Paruthipattu Lake spread over an area of 200 acres. The major motive of the program was to increase the green cover of the city.

In the special address, the chief guests urged the students to involve themselves in such activities and preserve our environment. This event was published in the Dinamalar newspaper on 28/7/2019.









#### PROJECT2 : PROJECT H20

The Department of English took part in the Porur Lake Cleaning Project, organised by the NGO Auttrupadi on 14th September 2019.

Mrs. Shobana Head of the Department, Department Of English and five staff members: Mrs. G.Tamilselvi, Mrs. Shiby Wilson, Mr. Mohanraj, Mrs. S.Subhapriya. Ms. N. Keethana and seventy three students enthusiastically participated in the event. Our students cleaned a 2km stretch of the Porur Lake surrounding the Madananandapuram area. The NGO provided the students with breakfast. They also provided them with cleaning supplies such as gloves, mask, and bags. The students helped to collect nearly 20 bags of garbage from the surrounding area.

They also created awareness to the people in the neighbouring area by performing song and slogans on the importance of preserving water bodies. This event was named as PROJECT H2O





#### PROJECT 3: PROJECT H20 – PALM SEED PLANTATION AND FENCING

Mrs. S.Shobana and our students participated in the palm seed plantation programme organised by the NGO Aatrupadai on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2019. The palm seeds were sown around the Porur Lake which had been cleaned earlier by the NGO and our students. Mrs. S.Shobana and the students received appreciation Certificates.

Our students also participated in the fencing of the plants around the Porur lake on  $3^{rd}$  October 2019. They worked for nearly 6 hours placing the fences around the plants for a stretch of 5 kms. Their efforts were highly appreciated by the NGO.

## • PROJECT 10 -SALE OF GREENS

#### • PROJECT 11 - VERMICOMPOST PIT

Subhapriya, Faculty Coordinators of the Eco Club took great efforts for the formation of the Vermicompost pit in the college campus. They selected the place for the pit, made arrangements for the JCB, and worked for nearly eight hours till the pit was dug. The fallen leaves from the trees in the college campus and the bio-degradable waste are collected in the pit. Cow dung from a goushala located nearby are brought by the gardeners and dropped inside the pit for the formation of the compost. This vermicompost pit was to be maintained by the Eco Club.





## • PROJECT 12 -CRESS DEPARTMENT GARDEN

To inculcate the concept of gardening, a department garden was started on 29<sup>th</sup> February 2020 in the Department of English. Mint, Coriander, fenugreek, ginger and mustard were sown in four different trays. G.Lalitha, Aadhilakshmi, Radhalakshmi of II B.A English, and S.Preethika of I B.A English were given in charge of maintaining the growth of these plants.





#### • PROJECT 13 - YOUNG LEADERS PLASTIC CHALLENGE

The students of the ECO Club took part in the International Challenge 'Tide Turner Plastic Challenge' organized by the World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF), a leading conservation organization. Ms. Srinidhi from the WWF gave an orientation to our students about the project on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2020. This event is conducted in partnership with UN environment to involve the youth in conservation, action and advocacy to reduce the use of plastics in day to day life.
